4<sup>th</sup> Grade

For the 12 Pesukim section you are only

required to know the first 2 Pesukim (pages 50, 51) in Hebrew in addition to their English meaning and explanation.

You are not responsible to know the Hebrew on pages 87 and 88. (The rest of the Hebrew blessings in the Mitzvot section (pages 67, 70, 85, 90) you ARE required to know.)

### 5<sup>th</sup> Grade

You are responsible to know all the

Hebrew blessings (pages 107, 109, 114) in the Jewish Holidays section.

You are required to know the names of the Jewish months (page 99).



You are responsible to know the

Hebrew names of:

- The five books of the Chumash (page 177)
- The Prophets (page 178)
- The Holy Writings (page 179)

You are not required to know the Hebrew names of:

- The six books of the Mishna (page 181)
- The books of the Shulchan Aruch (page 182)
